



From 8 June 2015 the DVLA will stop issuing the paper counterpart (D740) to the photocard driving licence.

The counterpart was introduced to display driving licence details that could not be included on the photocard. These details include some vehicle categories you are entitled to drive and any current endorsements/penalty points.

## Customers with existing counterparts

If you already hold a counterpart, after 8 June 2015 it will no longer have any legal status. You should destroy your counterpart after this date.



## Customers with paper driving licences

Paper driving licences issued before the photocard was introduced in 1998 will remain valid and should not be destroyed.
